A Message from the Manager:

As a regular user of the Club, you may have noticed the on-going work being done on the drainage near the entrance to the facility. The hope is that this will solve some of the flooding issues near the office and playground portion of the grounds. This project is meant to add additional permeable surface, where there once was concrete. Our in-house staff will repurpose some of the plant materials and update the irrigation near the pickleball courts. Another winter season project will be the annual maintenance of the pool deck and the refurbishment of a portion of the lounge chairs.

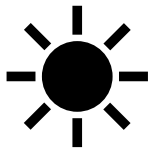
There are a couple of matters that have come to the attention of staff, and we could use your assistance in getting a handle on them. It seems that the pool table is constantly

being slid around in the billiard room. The community has spent funds on having it leveled in the past. We kindly ask if you need to move something to enhance your experience here, please ask first. There may be a good reason it is where it is. The second request is that there be no food or drink other than water on the tennis or pickleball courts. For safety considerations, proper footwear is also recommended. No one should be playing barefoot or in sandals.

REMINDERS FROM THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE:

- Homeowners are responsible for maintaining aging/overgrown trees and vegetation. Given recent fires, high winds and dry climate, this maintenance is especially important.
 - Waste bins must be stored out of sight of surrounding properties and the street. According to Westwood HOA Guidelines, waste bins are only allowed out for a 24-hour time frame on collection day.
 - An Architectural Review Application must be submitted for ALL changes that affect the exterior of the home or lot. Applications are available at the front office or on the website: www.rbwestwoodclub.com
 - Please remember that the ARC consists of a dedicated group of volunteers. The Committee meets the first and third Wednesday of each month. We ask that you schedule your projects and contractors accordingly.
 - Applications are to be turned into the office no later than the Friday prior to the meeting. This allows the committee time to review.
 - Signatures on your application are required as a courtesy to your neighbors, informing them of potential construction noise, additional vehicles etc. An application without signatures is considered incomplete.
 - Please provide detailed supporting documents for your project. Hard copies of paint swatches are required as colors do not scan or print accurately.

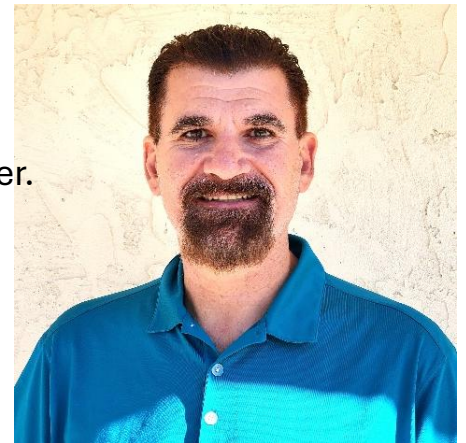
