Halloween Carnival


Saturday, October 28th

We also completed installing and bringing on-line solar panels on the gymnasium's roof. The hope is that this will begin to offset some of the Club's utility costs.


This fall the area just outside the office is scheduled to have two pickleball courts built. Construction is scheduled to start mid-October. This is going to be a two-phase project. Phase one will be the construction of the two courts. Phase two will include the installation of the lighting and a social area. 




Unopened and individually wrapped candy donations are appreciated for this year's Halloween event at the club. Please drop off items no later than Thursday, October 26th.

Architectural Committee FAQ's

Please remember that the ARC consists of a dedicated group of **volunteers**. The committee meets the first and third Wednesday of each month. We ask you schedule your projects and contractors appropriately.

-What projects require Committee approval?

An application must be submitted for any changes that affect the exterior of the home or lot.

-When is the submittal deadline?

We ask for applications to be in no later than the Friday prior to the meeting. This allows the committee time to review.

-Do I have to get neighbor signatures?

Yes. We require this as a courtesy to your neighbor no matter the project. An application without signatures is considered incomplete.

-What supporting documents are needed?

The more detail the better! Some examples are: paint swatches, landscape/hardscape plans, roof and window brochures, solar rooftop layout, etc.

REMINDER: Garbage bins must be stored out of sight. We have noticed more being left out lately. According to Westwood HOA guidelines, trash bins are allowed out for only a 24 hour time frame on pick-up day.
